What is it?

EUROLTA is an internationally recognised teacher training programme that trains you to teach languages using up-to-date methodologies, the latest IT platforms and with creativity.

The Certificate and the Diploma Level are recognized by the labour market as well as by the ICC, The International Language Association, a network of leading institutions of adult education in Europe and around the world.

How long does it take?

EUROLTA takes a minimum of 100 hours, depending on how the **EUROLTA** centre organises the course. You can take it: full-time, part-time, blended or online. Full-time may be an intensive 4-week course. Part-time may spread over 6 - 10 months. See the details of your local centre at the back of this brochure.

Assessment

Assessment is based on a portfolio including the documentation of several tasks focusing on the content areas below, plus records of all lessons and teaching sequences observed and taught by the trainer.

Core components of the training programme

EUROLTA offers you the necessary knowledge and competences needed as a language teacher. You will develop practical skills for teaching languages to adults and gain classroom confidence. You will identify your strengths and potential as a language trainer and set further development goals. The course will cover:

- Analysis of individual learning strategies and styles
- Analysis of teaching material
- Reflection on teaching techniques and activities
- Drawing up lesson plans
- Planning and observing sequences of lessons with subsequent trainer feedback

- Hands-on teaching experience
- Adapting tasks for specific groups of learners

Content areas

The topics to be explored in **EUROLTA** are grouped into the following content areas

- 1. Language awareness** – what do we need to know about a language and its pedagogical practice?
- 2. Language and culture** – how is culture intergrated in our teaching?
- 3. Language learning processes** - how do our learners learn?
- 4. Language teaching** - how can we best help our learners to learn?
- 5. Planning and evaluation** - how can we best plan and assess our teaching? How can we assess our learners' progress?
- 6. Self-assessment and development** - how can we best improve our competence as language teachers?
